

Vice President's Report Scott Broughton, CRNA

Hello my friends. Thank you for taking a glance at my VP report in the Airway. I have been reading the comments in General Community Digest about the proposed association name change. A lot of interesting conversation there but it seems that dissenting opinions seem to get shouted down by what I think is a very vocal minority.

It is an interesting idea though, right? Are we Nurse Anesthetists or Nurse Anesthesiologists? There is a lot to unpack there. What is in a name?

A little etymology:

"ology" refers to the study of some subject. Breaking it down further, logos means word. ologist refers to someone that has studied or has expert knowledge of a subject or a particular field of study. An "ologist" knows the words. "ist" refers to someone that practices a particular field. An ist does something. Some in the forum would have you believe that this connotes a tech of some sort. I disagree and I think psychiatrists, audiologists, gerontologists, archeologists, seismologists, and ornithologists would all disagree. Thinking about this etymology, it appears clear that we could use either. We study anesthesiology, take a rigorous test to prove our expertise in anesthesiology, and we get to practice, that is actually do, anesthesia.

Maybe I am wrong, but I feel that the important distinguishing part of this is that WE are the ones actually doing the anesthesia. There are other members of the team that have expert knowledge of anesthesia. But WE are the people with you during your anesthetic.

But there is so much more to it than just the words. Did you know that our title is defined in statute? The Nurse Practice Act is legal statute. In Missouri, it is a part of Chapter 335. We are, as laid out in statute Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists. An association name change will not change this. To change statute would take an act of the legislature. Is this where we want to expend our political capital? I really don't know. But I do know that the opposition to this move would be fiercely contested in this very doctor friendly legislature.

Do you guys remember the ASA study about public perception of what CRNAs call themselves? They found that as long as the word NURSE was in the language we used, public perception of our level of involvement in the anesthetic was lower. Would that be changed by this association name change?

I would love to hear your thoughts,

Are we Nurse Anesthetists or Nurse Anesthesiologists?



This money goes towards to getting the name of CRNA's and what we do out to our Legislators in Missouri through the fine work of our Government and Public Affairs Committees. This money keeps our website up and running. This money makes us as MOANA go.

So, forgoing your AANA dues as a way to voice your displeasure with them or their hierarchy will, in effect, cripple you as a practitioner by robbing you of your practice rights in Missouri. Make your voice heard, but keep *your* CRNA practice rights in Missouri safe by supporting *YOUR* state association, MOANA.




