As summer is ending, I look forward to October and our Fall Meeting in Margaritaville. Your board has been working very hard this year to achieve our vision of advancing the profession of nurse anesthesia in Missouri. Our strategic initiatives are important ways to reach our end goal to ensure and *possibly advance CRNA practice rights*. We are planning to introduce a bill that would advance our practice rights and fix the BNDD issue.

We cannot do this alone. For our plans to be successful, we need member participation.

Here are some action items you can participate in:

Be a Key Contact. All this requires is that you get to know your Senator and Representatives. Our Lobbying team can help you introduce yourself. We ask that you develop a relationship with them so that when we need their help they will be in support of our efforts. They need to hear from CRNAs. If you are willing to participate, please call or email any board member or Carol Kemna.

Consider a Monthly PAC Donation: Any donation, no matter how small, will assist us in our achieving a healthy PAC. Without a robust PAC, it will be impossible to achieve our legislative goals. Last I checked our opponents PAC had over \$200,000. We are not at all close to that. You'll never miss \$10-20 per month. Also, as many have heard me say over the years, either give of your time or your wallet. OR BOTH!

Volunteer for a committee or run for a board position. Are you someone that likes to post on social media or are you interested in promoting our profession? Or enjoys educating the public about what a CRNA is? Try joining the Public Relations committee. Or maybe you like helping to plan events and fund raising? Try the PAC committee. Enjoy advocacy at the state level? Consider government relations committee. We could sure use your help.

Your MoANA Board has been working hard on gearing up for the upcoming legislative session. We truly believe that our profession is a very fulfilling and rewarding vocation that provides access to healthcare for many thousands of Missourians. We have ongoing efforts in building alliances with other associations. 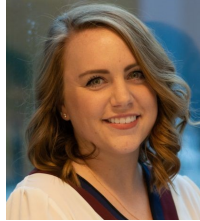

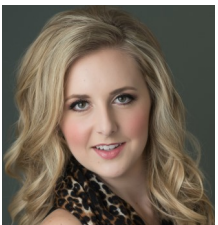

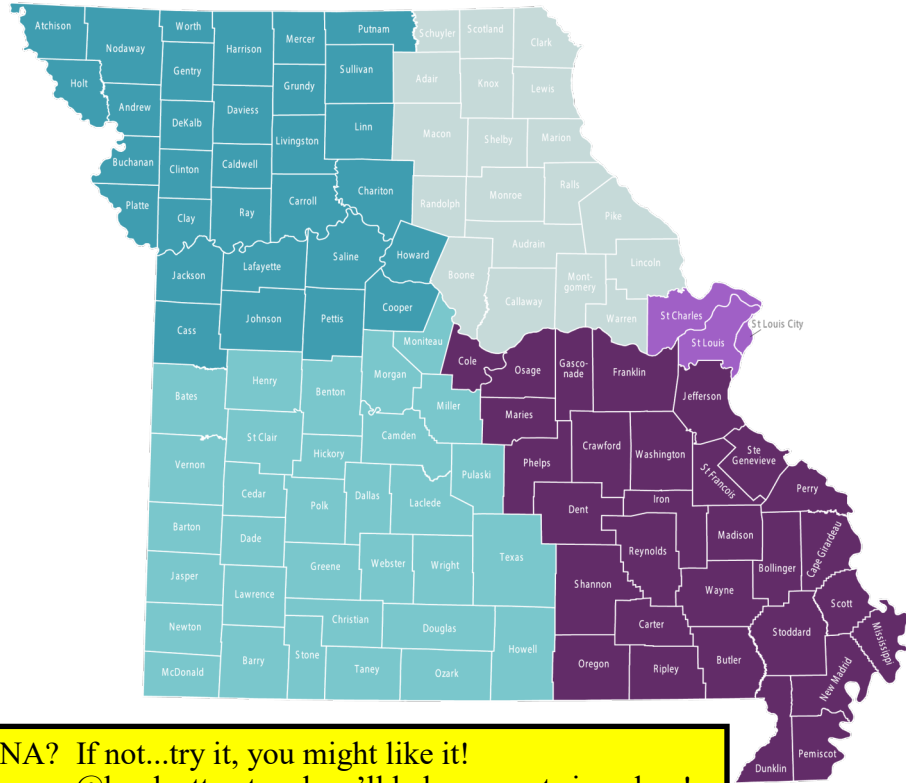

Treasurer's Report Scott Broughton, CRNA

MoANA Q3 (April 1st – June 30th)

The third fiscal quarter of 2022 closes with decreases in both our checking and our investment accounts.

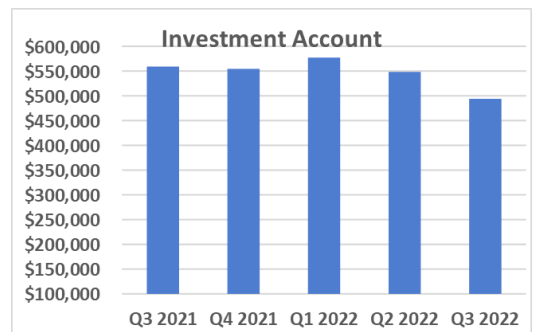
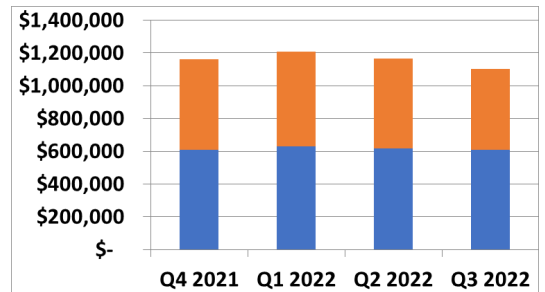
These decreases are not unexpected. Our AANA State Share deposits mostly come in Q4 and Q1. Our meeting revenue has been re-appropriated towards bolstering our PAC funds. Our outgoes are returning now that things are beginning to normalize after pandemic related shutdowns and cancellations.

Significant continued expenses, likely above our budgeted amounts, are anticipated with our upcoming legislative efforts over the next several years. Even if our initial efforts see overwhelming success, we should anticipate the response of the MSA, Missouri Medical Society, and BOHA to follow us for a while.

Our checking account on June 30th held \$607,222. Down 1.5% over Q2. Our investment account on June 30th contained \$493,855. This represents a drop of 9.9% over this quarter. While this sounds rough, it compares favorably to the S&P 500 which dropped by 16.73% over the same period.

We continue to be in a fairly strong financial position. Caution is advised as we determine in what ways we would like to deplete our war chest in this down market. Any liquidation of assets in our investment account during this period will be "selling low" and impact how our account will be able to rebound as the market recovers.

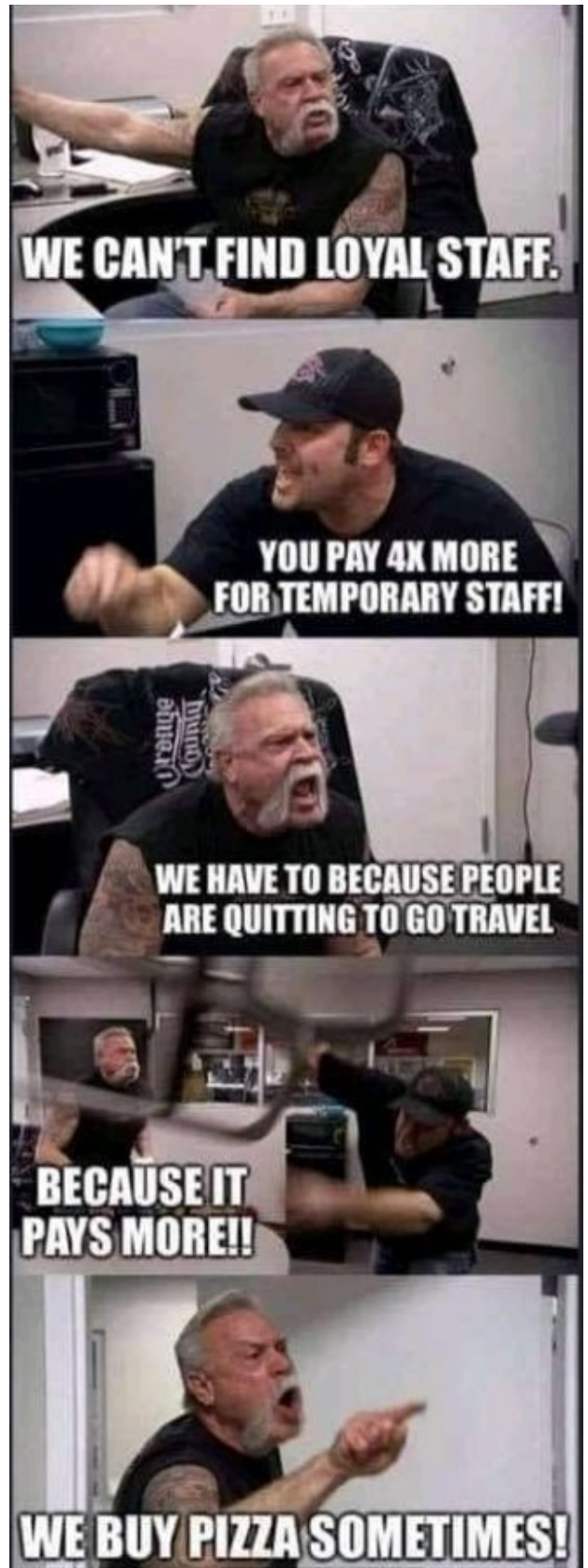

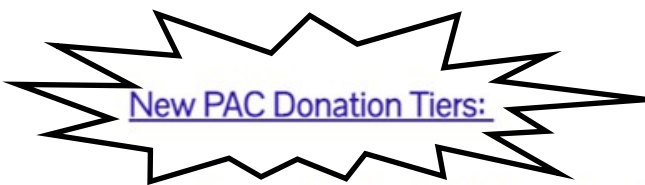

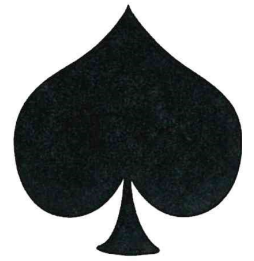

Bernadette Henrichs Receives AANA's 43rd Annual Helen Lamb Outstanding Educator

The American Association of Nurse Anesthesiology (AANA) presented Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA) Bernadette Henrichs, PhD, CRNA, CCRN, CHSE, FAANA, with the 43rd Annual Helen Lamb Outstanding Educator Award during its 2022 Annual Congress, August 12-16, in Chicago.

The Helen Lamb Outstanding Educator Award, established in 1980, is presented to a CRNA who has made a significant contribution to the education of nurse anesthetists. The award recognizes the individual's commitment to the profession of nurse anesthesia and to the advancement of educational standards that further the art and science of anesthesiology and result in high-quality patient care.

Henrichs has dedicated her life's work to promoting the nurse anesthesia profession through many significant contributions to the education of nurse anesthetist students over the years. Currently, Henrichs is the director and a professor for the Nurse Anesthesia Program at Goldfarb School of Nursing at Barnes-Jewish College as well as the director and professor of CRNA Education and Research in the Department of Anesthesiology at Washington University School of Medicine. The original nurse anesthesia program at Barnes-Jewish Hospital was established by Helen Lamb in 1929, and when the program dissolved, it was Dr. Henrichs who re-established the program in 2004 at Barnes-Jewish College. Last year, her graduates honored her with the Helen Lamb Outstanding Didactic Instructor.

Since then, the Nurse Anesthesia Program at Goldfarb School of Nursing has been honored with becoming the second school in the U.S., and the fourth school in the world, to gain accreditation by the International Federation of Nurse Anesthetists. She is considered a pioneer in the use of clinical simulation for nurse anesthesia education. Henrichs conducts simulation with her students weekly during the duration of the clinical portion of the program, helping them to prepare for responding to anesthetic crises.

Prior to starting that program, she was clinical coordinator and chief CRNA at the Washington University Department of Anesthesiology and adjunct assistant professor and assistant program coordinator at Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville. Henrichs also has been called upon as a consultant on nurse anesthesia in the United States as well as China and England.

"Like the leader that came before her, Helen Lamb, Dr. Bernadette Henrichs unambiguously represents everything a nurse anesthetist should aspire to be," her nomination said. "She is passionate about and devoted to uplifting the nurse anesthesia profession through educating and cultivating nurse anesthesia leaders."

"I am so honored to follow in Helen Lamb's footsteps and continue her tradition of training nurse anesthetists at our medical center. It has truly been an honor and one of the greatest achievements and highlights of my life," said Henrichs of the award.

Henrichs is a graduate of St. Louis University with a PhD in educational studies and a Master of Science in Nursing. She received her certificate in nurse anesthesia education from Washington University in St. Louis and a bachelor's degree in nursing from Southern Illinois University in Edwardsville.

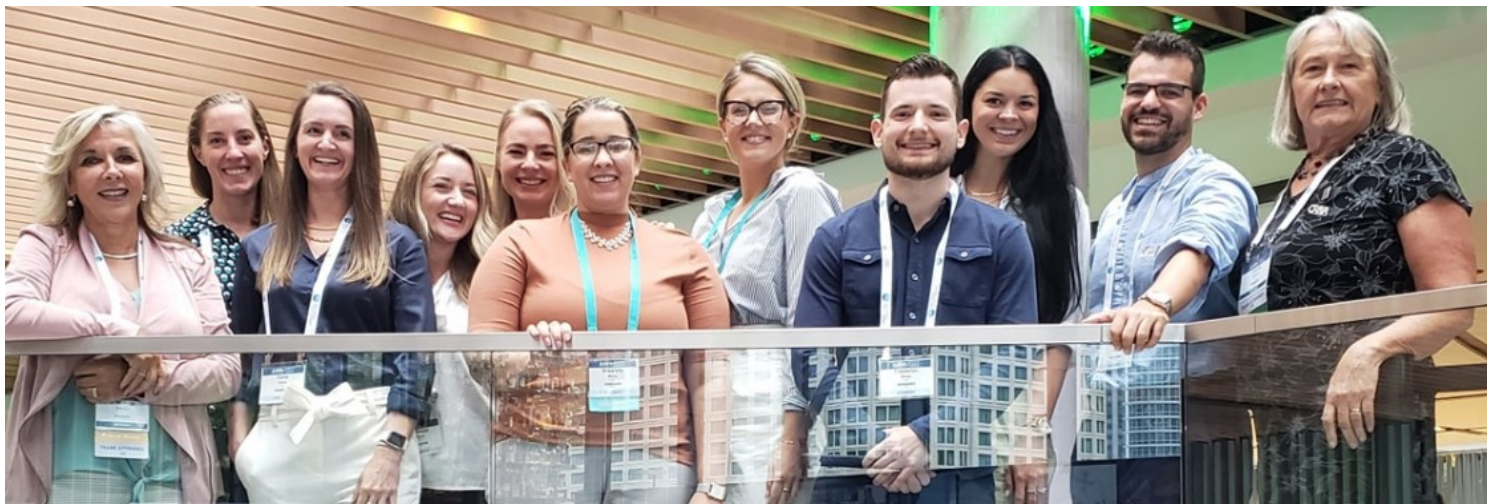

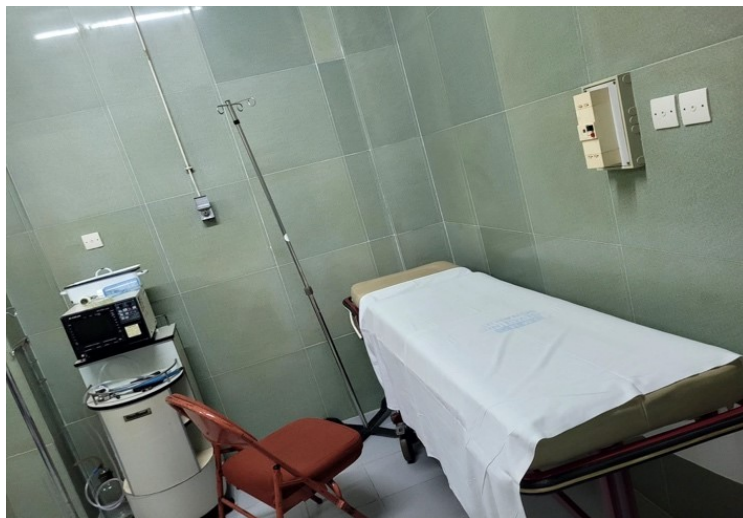
