

#### Missouri CRNA Brings Leadership Beyond the OR

A recent appointee to the Christian County Health Department Board of Trustees in Christian County, Missouri, Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA) Jeanie Skibiski, DNAP, MHA, CRNA, believes it is important for all CRNAs to leave the operating room and bring healthcare into their communities. "We are smart people and have skills we can bring to help our communities. There are a lot of great CRNAs but if you don't leave the OR people don't know you exist, don't see the person behind the mask giving them drugs."

By being active and involved, even on just a local level, CRNAs can positively impact change. "CRNAs should advocate for themselves. Talk to legislators, get out of the OR, and see what you can do to help your community."

As a Board of Trustees member, Skibiski hopes to continue health department activities such as food pantries and other healthcare programs. "Our county includes a very rural population with many underserved members. It is important that programs such as the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC), nutrition, mental health, and basic wellness Jeanie Skibiski, DNAP, MHA, programs and vaccination opportunities stay available for our community."



**CRNA** 

Being a CRNA, like most healthcare professions, can be stressful. Every day is different and every day the well-being of another human may be dependent upon your actions. Skibiski, recognizes this, but also knows the patients she sees as staff CRNA at Mercy Healthcare System in Springfield, Missouri, may be under distress.

"Going through surgery is stressful and CRNAs have the opportunity to put patients at ease," Skibiski said. "I always try to relate to the patient on an individual basis. I want them to know that they are important and my sole focus for as long as they need anthesia care."

Skibiski understands that taking care of her patients means keeping them safe. In addition to the many protocols in her nursing and anesthesia training, she has taken the extra step to become a Certified Professional in Patient Safety<sup>TM</sup> (CPPS) through the Institute for Healthcare Improvement. To receive this credential, Skibiski was required to demonstrate a high level of proficiency in the core standards of patient safety. She passed a thorough examination covering five patient safety domains: Culture, Leadership, Patient Safety Risks and Solutions, Measuring and Improving Performance, and Systems Thinking and Design/Human Factors.

"One of my passions is patient safety. As an assistant professor at the Missouri State University School of Anesthesia I teach anesthesia delivery to entry-level CRNAs as well as those studying for a doctorate. It is important that CRNAs and all healthcare professionals evaluate the systems in place and recognize areas of potential safety issues," Skibiski said.

A challenge to safety, according to Skibiski, is the human factor. "We all have biases that can impact our perception of what is going on in any setting. When we impose human flaws on a poorly designed system, patients can get hurt. For example, an unfamiliar IV pump could result in wrong dosage being administered. As CRNAs we are in a position to see the bigger picture, understand and correct any potential issues and when necessary, change the system."

Skibiski is proud that she can mentor future CRNAs. "My students get excited about the things they can do to make their healthcare system safe," she said. "By encouraging CRNAS to teach others and lead others we become safety advocates for our healthcare system, beyond being in one room taking care of one patient."

Safety, Skibiski points out, reaches beyond the patient. "One of the things I teach my students is about the second victim. If an error happens, as the healthcare professional involved, you feel guilty and wonder if there was something different you could have done. It is important that we provide peer support and connect our distressed colleagues to resources for help."

# Nurse anesthetist writes poem about experience with unvaccinated patients

He says the title, "See You Soon Unvaccinated Ones," is poignant and powerful

Michael Burns has been on two front lines since the start of the coronavirus pandemic.

The Assistant Professor of Anesthesia at Webster University is still spreading important messages to his students.

"It's basically, you know, social distance. Wear your mask. Get vaccinated," Burns said

Burns is also the Director of Anesthesia and a nurse anesthetist at Phelps Health in Rolla.

He said for the past few months he has documented a disturbing trend: an increasing number of younger, unvaccinated patients.

"Roughly, 88% of the patients that are hospitalized with covid at our facility are unvaccinated," said Burns.

He adds those unvaccinated people are either being admitted to the hospital's intensive care unit with COVID-19 or sadly, dying from the virus.

"A majority are in their 50s and 60s, but we're seeing more and more of the younger age groups coming including people who are as young as 30 years old. We see them tell their family members goodbye. It's pretty sad. We're definitely watching more heartbreaking instances that would be preventable with a vaccine," said Burns.

Burns knows the sudden loss first hand.

In March, his 57-year-old brother also died from COVID.

"He was unvaccinated and certainly all of this together has kind of hit home pretty hard," he said.

Burns' COVID-related experiences have had a huge impact on him, so much so that he penned a pandemic-related poem.

"It's great to increase awareness to our patients that are unvaccinated. I want them to know that it doesn't just affect them. It affects other people," said the concerned professor.

He admits the title, "See You Soon Unvaccinated Ones," is poignant and powerful.

However, the professor doesn't want to scare people.

Instead, he wants them to hear his plea before it's too late.

"My message is simple. I'd like you to get your vaccine and help protect our communities and yourselves," said Professor Burns.

Burns also recited a couple of lines from his poem during an interview with 5 On Your Side's Robert Townsend:


"I may be the last person to see you alive.
